## False Indigo



Baptisia australis (and other species and cultivars)

Spectacular and long lived native perennials for sun to partial shade



Bumblebees frequent the blooms of all the baptisia varieties

Baptisias do best in poor soils, with full sun and do not like being moved. Rarely bothered by pests, but voles sometimes go for them. We grow many species and varieties. All are

- deer resistant,
- drought tolerant,
- clay adapted,
- disease free,
- several produce attractive seed pods for winter interest

Blue False Indigo Although slow growing, the False Indigos are worth the wait. They slowly spread to be incredible specimens in a border or meadow. Great with Switchgrass, Coreopsis, and Mountain Mints, Dwarf Ninebark.
